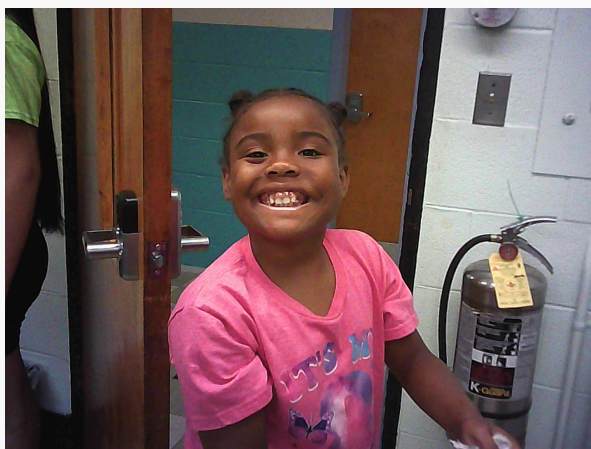

As we reflect on 2025, we are filled with gratitude for a community that continues to stand beside the Springfield Boys & Girls Club and the young people we serve. This past year was defined by growth — not only on our campus, but in opportunity, engagement, and belonging for our youth. One of the most exciting milestones was the opening of our new Teen Wing, made possible by a generous partnership with Aaron's. Three redesigned spaces now give teens a place of their own: a music room for creativity, a gaming room that builds connection, and a recreation room where friendships grow and homework gets done.

We also unveiled Sarno Family Park during our Legacy and Gratitude Summer Celebration — a transformational outdoor expansion featuring bright basketball courts, a shaded learning pavilion, expansive multi-sport fields, and even a time capsule to be opened in 50 years. This space allows us to expand athletics, outdoor education, and daily active play while giving youth a healthy place to gather and thrive.

This year also marked the 25th anniversary of both the Camp Fore Kids Golf Tournament and the Festival of Trees. These events ensure that no child is ever turned away due to financial barriers, allowing every family access to camp experiences and Club programming.

25TH ANNUAL CAMP FORE KIDS GOLF TOURNAMENT

The 2025 Camp Fore Kids Golf Tournament was an outstanding success, bringing together 104 golfers in support of our mission. Through the generosity of participants, sponsors, and community partners, the tournament raised over \$50,000.

The golf tournament enables us to provide scholarships for our drop-in youth, making summer camp accessible at just \$150 per week, while helping to prevent summer learning loss. This event continues to play a vital role in expanding access to safe, enriching, and memorable summer experiences for Springfield youth.

The 25th anniversary of the Festival of Trees was a truly historic and unforgettable milestone for our Club and the Springfield community. This year's celebration welcomed over 12,500 visitors and raised more than \$300,000, making it one of our most successful years yet.

LEGACY & GRATITUDE

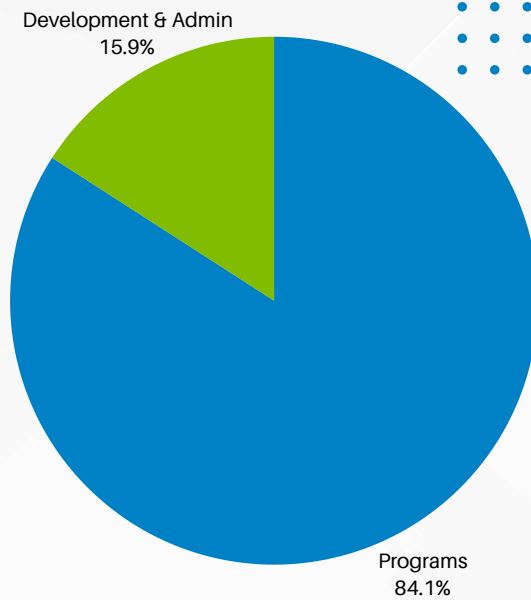

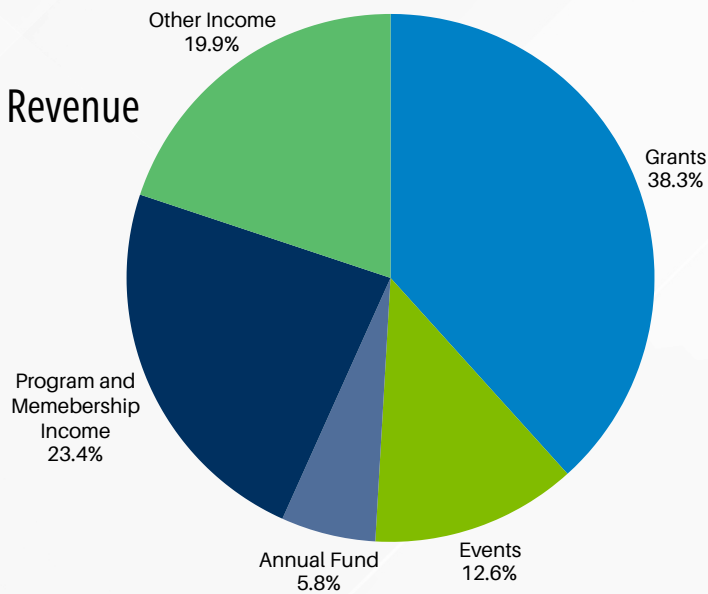

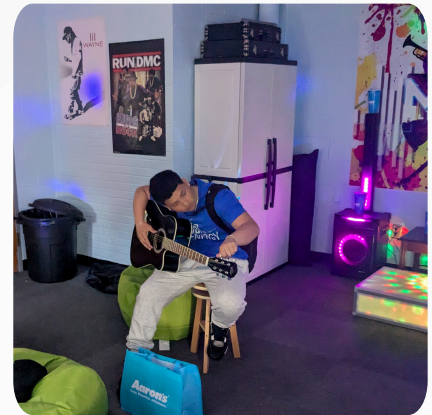
Aaron's Teen Wing Refresh

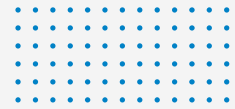

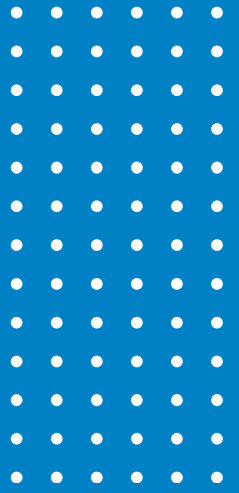
